Chinmaya Vision Programme is a comprehensive educational programme for school which integrates the best in our culture and philosophy of education. It aims at giving children a true vision of life to help them face challenges in a positive and dynamic manner and heartily contribute to society.

The Chinmaya Vision programme can be identified under four heads.

#### 1. Integrated Development

5. Work out problems in mathematics several times. Mere reading will be of no use.

7. There is a time for work and time for play. While studying let your whole heart be on studies and while at play, enjoy it completely.

## SCHOLARSHIP AND AWARDS

### IV. Admissions and withdrawals

The minimum age for admission to LKG and Std. I is completion of 3½ and 5½ years respectively. Parents desirous of getting their children admitted to the school are requested to get them registered and obtain the prospectus and the application form on payment of Rs. 100/- Registration, however, is no guarantee of admission. The child has to sit for an assessment and appear for an interview on the appointed date and time except in the case of LKG admissions. For admission to LKG there will be an interview with the parents along with the candidates. Admission will be made subject to availability of seats.

Students of UKG who have successfully completed their KG course should seek fresh admission in Std I. For this, the parents should adhere to the admission date schedule notified by the school. Non - adherence can imply that the ward does not need the seat in Std I. They are to bring the convocation certificate at the time of admission. Application forms duly filled in may be submitted on the stipulated date along with the original birth certificate and Xerox copy of it.

Students coming from other schools should bring their transfer certificates. New students must be introduced personally by their parents/ guardians who will be responsible for their regularity of attendance and payment of dues. Right of admission is reserved with the Management and the decision of the management in this regard is final.

Admission to the higher classes is subject to availability of seats, performance in the assessment and production of T.C. duly countersigned by the educational officer concerned. T.Cs produced from foreign countries must be countersigned by the Indian Embassy of the country concerned.

Admission to Class XI will normally be taken up after the declaration of Class X results (AISSE) of the CBSE. The rules and regulations will be put on the notice board immediately after C results (AISSE)

Transfer Certificate will be given only on the basis of a written application in the prescribed form, (available at the Reception Counter) to be submitted at least a week in advance by the parent / guardian. However, if a letter regarding the urgency is produced from the school where the student is seeking admission, Transfer Certificate will be issued on the third day of application. It will be issued, however, only to those who have fully settled their dues.

## **V. Aaminations and Holidays**

From Standares I to V, we follow the evaluation system in accordance with the CBSE directions. As regards the rest of the

classes (from Standard VI to XII) there will be series of test and terminal Exam in addition to the Annual Exam. For Standard X to XII, there will be two preboard Exams in addition to the Board Exam. Ordinarily, the session commences in the first week of June and ends on 31st March. There will be about a weeks holidays each during Onam and Christmas, and two months summer vacation in April and May, besides other public holiday as notified. There will be coaching classes in March for classes IX, X & XII. Attendance is compulsory.

## **VI. Rules of Promotion**

The promotion of a student to the next higher standard depends on his/her overall performance during the entire session. Since due credit is given to projects/ oral work assignments (written and oral), periodic tests, Ist term and IInd term examinations, it is very essential that the student takes all the tests and completes all assignments in time. If a student is absent for any of the above, he/she will forgo the marks allotted. Re-tests or re- assignments will not be held.

For a pass, from one standard to the next higher standard, a student must get atleast 33% marks in each subject or the total performance as arrived at in the last column in the progress report. Also a student must get atleast 75% attendance. The decision of the school authorities in the matter of promotion shall be final. A student who fails twice in the same class will be asked to leave the school.

## **FOR CLASS VI TO IX**

- \* School will conduct Annual Examinations for 80 marks in each subject covering 100% syllabus of the subject.
- \* Students have to secure 33% marks out of 80 marks in all subjects.
- \* Students have to secure 33% marks out of overall 20 marks (Internal Assessments) earmarked for each subject.

## X. School Discipline

The following Rules of discipline are to be strictly followed:

1. **The School Diary should be brought to the school every-day including examination days.**
2. Students must be in Vidyalaya premises 5 minutes before the first bell. Repeated late- comers should not enter the class without the Principal's permission. They should also get the late attendance record in the school diary signed by their parents.
3. The school uniform, washed and ironed, must be worn on all school days and at all school functions. If a student is not in the prescribed uniform, he/she may be fined/sent home and the responsibility will lie with the parents. Students shall wear uniform on all formal occasions such as special classes and functions on holidays also.
4. Students shall speak only English in the school premises except in language classes. Defaulters are liable to be fined.
5. On meeting teachers/ authorities for the first time in a day whether in the school or outside, students shall greet them, saying, 'Hari Om' with joined palms.

6. When a teacher / distinguished visitor enters the class, students should stand up, greet him/her saying 'HARI OM' with takes his / her seat or asks them to sit down.
7. **Gold jewellery or any other ornaments like bangles, anklets, pearl chain, talisman etc. should not be brought to the school. In the case of girls, if anyone is to wear simple ornament on earlobes, it should be limited to one pair of earstuds only and not any other decorative type including on birthdays. Unauthorised books, magazines, toys or such other articles are not to be brought to the school. Only students of Std. V and above can wear wrist watches. (Ordinary wrist watches and not fancy ones)**
8. Students are not allowed to meet parents or visitors or to leave the school premises during school hours without the prior permission of the principal, Head Mistress.
9. Students are themselves responsible for the safety of their personal belongings like books, writing materials and lunchboxes.
10. Students are strictly forbidden to write or scribble on school walls or furniture or disfigure the class- rooms or damage any property. Parents / Guardians will have to compensate for any such damage done to school property by their wards. Moreover, disciplinary action may also be taken against them. Regarding damages done by students who are unable to be identified the whole class will be penalised.
11. Parents are requested not to give any money to their children without specific purpose. They are also requested not to entrust the payment of fees to their wards.
12. Students having full day session should preferably bring lunch from home. In case they wish to buy it from school canteen, they should obtain the lunch coupon before 9.30 am. They should not leave the school campus during the recess time, without the prior permission from the principal.
13. **ONLY VEGETARIAN FOOD SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO THE SCHOOL. VIOLATORS WILL BE FINED.**

14. For going home for lunch and to go to the mosque on fridays an application in duplicate should be submitted to the principal in June.
15. Giving tips/gift to the School Staff is againts the rules of the Vidyalaya.
16. Every student must take part in school games and other activities unless declared physically unfit or exempted by the principal. Weekly Balavihar classes are also compulsory for all students.
17. While going to /coming from the assembly, PT or any other classes, or to the dining all, students should walk in line silently.
18. Students upto Std. IV should use only pencil, and not pen. They should be regular in submitting home work assignments. Disciplinary action will be taken for failure to do so. Parents are requested to ensure regularity in

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## **VISITING HOURS TO MEET PRINCIPAL**

- Parents can meet the Principal between 1.00 pm and 1.30 pm on all working days. However, in case of special issues, parents can meet him / her on prior appointment.
25. No private tuition by the Vidyalaya staff will be permitted without the prior approval of the management. Parents are requested not to approach teachers directly.
  26. It is essential that all parents attend the open Day whenever held. Failure to do so without sufficient reason will be treated as a lapse on the part of the parents in discharging their obligation.

- ❖ Girls of all classes having shoulder length or more hair should plait it into two with white ribbons. If the hair is sufficiently long the plaited hair must be folded and tied.
- ❖ Girls must wear petticoat or camisole with broad shoulder straps from class 1 onwards. Shorts should be worn under the skirts (I-V Class)
- ❖ Boys must wear half sleeved banian from class 1 onwards, inside their shirt.
- ❖ Low waist trousers are strictly prohibited.
- ❖ Gold ornaments are not permitted except perhaps a small ear stud/ ring.
- ❖ Digital / Smart watches are not allowed. Only ordinary wrist watches are permitted.
- ❖ All students should wear the school identity card everyday.
- ❖ Students are **NOT PERMITTED** to:
  - a) Colour their hair
  - b) Grow/ Varnish their nails
  - c) Wear Jeans and T - shirts
  - d) Wear low waist / skinny pants/ leggings
  - e) Immodest hair style and facial hair.

NB: Instructions to be strictly followed by the boys from Class VII to Class XII, regarding their Uniform.

Low waist fashion which has become common now a days is strictly prohibited.

The School has a spacious library with a large collection of books. Library periods are provided for in the time table and students of class III and above are issued books from the library.

Students should maintain a record of the extra reading done by them, in a separate notebook. This will be checked by the Librarian. The ‘best readers’ are awarded annually, encouraging the reading habits among the students.

## **21. SCHOOL CANTEEN**

The School has arranged with a private party to run a canteen on the campus for the benefit of the students. The following rules should be strictly followed by students.

1. They will follow orderliness and go to canteen only in line.
2. They will not throw rubbish like wrappers, etc anywhere on campus except in the dustbin.
3. They will visit the canteen only during the permitted hours.
4. They will not spend excessively on canteen items.
